1. **Their-** pronoun. Shows possession of something.
 - **Their** clothes got dirty from working in the yard.
2. **There-** adverb. To describe someone's location OR to introduce (start) a sentence.
 - I put my book down over **there**.
 - **There** are 20 people in my class.
3. **They're-** contraction. Stands for "they+are".
 - They're going to see a movie at 6:30.

4. Your- pronoun. Showing possession *to you*.

- **Your** clothes look big on you.

5. You're- contraction. Stands for "you+are".

- **You're** going to get cold if you lose your jacket.

6. It's- contraction. Stands for "it+is".

- **It's** a beautiful, sunny, warm day today.

7. Its- pronoun. Shows possession.

- What is the name of that movie? I forgot **its** title.

8. Two- adjective. The counting number “2”

- My cousin is **two** years old.

9. To-preposition. In a direction towards OR to the extent of OR paired with a verb.

- I drove **to** the park.
- She veered **to** the right.
- The horse wanted **to** run.

10. Too-adverb. To mean “also” OR more than enough OR very/extremely.

- I ate **too** much pie at dinner!
- Did you get mosquito bites, **too**?

11. Right- adj or noun. Something is good, or true. OR opposite of “left”

- She answered the question **right**!
- Will you turn **right**, please?

12. Write- verb. To make letters and words with a pen/pencil

- You will **write** an essay this year.

13. Rite- noun. A solemn ceremony, such as a marriage.

- A Bar Mitzvah is a **rite** of passage to Jewish adulthood.
